


















Authority Data versus Descripitive Data

- Authority data as linking point in the cultural sector


Descriptive data are good for library users and other libraries





- GND Authority file for persons, corporate bodies, conferences and events, geographic entities (places), topics and works
- Used for descpritive and subject cataloguing
- Cataloguing Codes
 - RDA (since July 2014)
 - RSWK (German rules for the subject catalogue)

Figlio di Louis, dirigente della Banca di commercio, e di Constance Paccard; abiatico di David-Marc Paccard. ∞ Alice Perdonnet, figlia di Gustave, banchiere, e abiatica di Vincent Perdonnet. Studiò letteratura e diritto all'Acc. di Ginevra, laureandosi in diritto nel 1868 e ottenendo in seguito il brevetto di avvocato. Nel 1874 fu eletto deputato al Gran Consiglio ginevrino quale candidato indipendente della destra liberale conservatrice (che in seguito si costituì come partito democratico); nel 1876 non venne rieletto e tornò in Gran





- Own standards and cataloguing tradition
- No data exchange
- RDA: too complex and too many rules
- "Core RDA"






- With every update more complex?
- RDA community is a community of librariens
- No higher-level organisational structure for cultural institutions in the German-speaking countries


GND

- Well developed and organisational structure.
- Further institutions can be integrated.
- Using authority data brings a direct benefit for practical work.
- Rules for authority data are well worked out in RDA and relatively stable.






