It's very simple: musicians and performers from 10 different places on 5 continents are hooked up by an international conference call. They play to each other over the phone - and the world is all ears.

All you need is an amplifier for the telephone so that a large group can participate. Then wait for the world to give you a call.

After an introduction and roll-call, each group, one at a time, will play a 3 minute musical piece, which is heard by all others at their end of the line.

There will also be room for freestyle improvisation, with musicians 20.000 miles apart joining a tune from somewhere over the rainbow.

The concert will last for about one hour.

That day, June 21., is the longest day in the Northern Hemisphere as well as the shortest day in the Southern Hemisphere. And the full moon shines on both.

Up to 4000 people have come together on previous global conference calls, which Media-philosophers have called 'public communication sculpture'. The point of the TRANSWORLD TELEPHONE CONCERT is not so much to talk to the world as to listen to her music and to celebrate her sounds.
