## Address by H.E. Dr. Vaira Vike-Freiberga, President of Latvia, at the accreditation ceremony of Sokol Gjoka, Ambassador of the Republic of Albania to Latvia, Riga, October 28, 2003

Your Excellency,

It is a great pleasure for me to welcome you as Albanias Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to Latvia.

I am glad that in the time since Latvia has regained its independence and Albania has recovered its freedom from dictatorship, our countries are continuing on the path of democratic reform. While these times present difficult challenges and are bringing forth radical change, our adherence to noble goals and values will ensure the sustainability of our reforms.

Your appointment to this high position of trust is a significant event in the history of relations between Latvia and Albania. The diplomatic relations that were established between our two countries more than ten years ago are now acquiring a new impetus.

Your term as Ambassador also begins at a new and significant stage in the history of my country, which is preparing for full membership in the European Union and the NATO Alliance. Latvian soldiers, together with peacekeepers from Albania, are honorably fulfilling their task of helping to ensure peace and security in Iraq.

While there remains a great deal of untapped potential in our countries bilateral relations, experience shows that shared goals and principles are the main prerequisites for developing and maintaining partnerships. A clear and united perception of the future provides us with ample opportunities for developing our bilateral relations.

I am convinced that your appointment as Albanias Ambassador to Latvia, at a time that is so important in the history of our both countries, will provide new potential for further bilateral cooperation between our nations.
