Address by the President of the Republic of Latvia on the occasion of the accreditation of the Ambassador of the Kingdom of Nepal Lila Prasad Sharma

Your Excellency!

It is a great pleasure for me to welcome you as the first Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Kingdom of Nepal to the Republic of Latvia.

Your assignment to this esteemed post is an important event in the history of relations between Latvia and Nepal. I am convinced that this day will become a point of reference in the diplomatic relations between Latvia and Kingdom of Nepal, which this year have reached their tenth anniversary.

Latvia has always been open to friends and cooperation. The Latvian nation takes pride in its unique cultural heritage and Latvia supports the interest of the Kingdom of Nepal to enhance our cooperation in this field.

Today mutual support and cooperation within the framework of multilateral structures, particularly in the United Nations Organization, serve as one means of interstate cooperation. This is of particular importance, as you just mentioned, Mr. Ambassador, for such small countries as Latvia and Nepal.

The term of your work in Latvia coincides with important decisions concerning Latvias membership in the European Union and NATO. I am confident that in the very near future the relations between Latvia and Nepal will develop as relations between an EU memberstate and a partner of this organization in Asia.
